## **From The Mayor**

#### **Mulch at DPW**

Village and Town residents are allowed a maximum of 6 yards of free mulch per year from the DPW (5 Elm St). Mulch must be loaded by the resident and is available during regular working hours only. Brush may also be dropped off during the times listed. The DPW is open regular working hours of 6:30am-4pm Mondays through Thursdays, and from 7:30am until 10am on Fridays. It will also be open on the last Saturday of the month in June, July, August and September from 9am-2pm. For further information contact the DPW at 657-7319.

## **Open Burning**

There is a Village Zoning Law prohibiting any open burning within the Village limits, with the following exceptions; campfires no higher than 3 feet, small cooking fires and ceremonial or celebratory bonfires. Brush burning is not allowed. The DPW picks up brush twice per year, May and October. Brush can also be dropped off at the DPW,(see Mulch article above).

# **Animals in the Village**

Village zoning law prohibits the raising, harboring, or housing of many animal species to include chickens, ducks, rabbits, fowl, goats, horses, and many more. This is a code violation! A maximum of 3 dogs per household of licensing age and 3 cats which are 6 months or more in age may be kept. If you have any questions, please call code enforcement at 657-7700 option 4.

# Firearms in the Village

Just a reminder that the discharge of firearms is prohibited within the Village limits. Firearms include rifles, shotguns, pistols, bow and arrows and air powered rifle.

## **Ontario County Recycles Events**

The 2022 Special Collection Event dates have been released! Most events require pre-registration with the exception of paper shredding and pumpkin recycling. Information for drop off locations of other items including appliances, batteries, furniture, hazardous waste, medications and more, can be found on their website https://ontariocountyrecycles.org/150/Events.

The dates and events are **Household Hazardous Waste-** September 10<sup>th</sup> at the Town of Bristol Highway Facility 7am,-3pm. **Electronic Waste-** Oct 22<sup>nd</sup> at the landfill 8am-2pm. **Residential Tire-** July 16<sup>th</sup> at Manchester Highway Facility, and Sept 17<sup>th</sup> at the Richmond Town Hall 8-11am. **Paper Shredding** Oct 7<sup>th</sup> both at the County Transportation Center from 10:30am-1:30pm.

#### Rabies Clinics

Because we have documented rabies in our county, New York State Law requires every dog, cat, and ferret at least 3 months of age be vaccinated against rabies at all times. Each year Ontario County Public Health provides six free rabies clinics throughout the county. The 2022 rabies clinics run from 9AM-Noon and are scheduled for the following dates August 13th, September 10th, and October 15th. All clinics will be held at the Ontario County Public Works at 2962 County Road 48 in Canandaigua. Clinics are FREE but donations are appreciated. Dogs, Cats and ferrets must be healthy and at least 12 weeks old. Bring your most recent rabies certificate with you if possible. Pets must be on a leash or in a carrier.
