From The Mayor

November 2nd is Election Day. Local contested offices in the town of East Bloomfield include Town Supervisor and 2 Town Board seats. Poll hours are 6am-9pm at Veteran's Park. If you are unsure of your registration status, contact the Ontario County Board of Elections at 396-4005.

We encourage you to place signs in your yard supporting the candidate of your choice. Signs must be placed out of the right-of-way on the house side of the sidewalk. Please remove them promptly after the election.

Village Tax Bills

Reminder that any Village taxes not paid by November 2nd will be rolled over to the County for collection on your January County tax bill. Payments can be made by mail, with a credit card on our website, or in person at the Village Office, 12 Main St. PO Box 459 **Please do not pay at the Town Hall.** All questions regarding addresses, including changes to tax bills for those owners residing out of the area, are handled by the Town Assessor's Office, 585-657-7700 option 5.

Rabies Clinics

New York State Law requires every dog, cat, and ferret at least 3 months of age be vaccinated against rabies at all times. Each year Ontario County Public Health provides six free rabies clinics throughout the county. The 2021 rabies clinics run from 9AM-Noon. The final date for the rabies clinic is October 16th and will be held at the Ontario County Public Works at 2962 County Road 48 in Canandaigua. All attending the clinic are required to wear a mask. Clinics are FREE but donations are appreciated. Dogs, Cats and ferrets must be healthy and at least 12 weeks old. Bring your most recent rabies certificate with you if possible. Pets must be on a leash or in a carrier. For more information call Ontario County Public Health at (585) 396-4343 or visit

Brush Pickup

The scheduled **brush pickup is the week of October 18th**. Please have your brush by the curb with branches parallel to the road but not in the road or in the gutters. You may bring your brush to the WWTP Monday through Thursday from 8 am until 4 pm. We are not able to take leaves. Please do not rake leaves into the gutters or into the street and please keep the gutters and the street free of grass clippings, as they clog the drainage system. A local Village resident, Gregory Badger, may be able to compost your leaves! The leaves must be in paper bags and please call him at 585-727-0862 to see if he is able to use them.

Fire Hydrants and Plowing

Winter will be here before we know it. Please be sure to keep any fire hydrant that is close to your home free of snow this winter. Also be sure that you do not plow the snow from your driveway across the sidewalk or street. There is no parking on village streets from 2 am until 6 am. This is strictly enforced from Nov. 1 through April 30 so that snow plows can properly clean the streets.

Hunting Season and Firearms

Hunting season is fast approaching. Just a reminder that the discharge of firearms is prohibited within the Village limits. Firearms include rifles, shotguns, pistols, bow and arrows and air powered rifles.
